What is Unclaimed Property?

Unclaimed property can be a multitude of financial assets including dormant bank accounts, uncashed checks, rebate payments, insurance policies, stocks, bonds and more.

Unclaimed Property Tips for Nonprofit Organizations

Search for unclaimed property online at patreasury.gov/unclaimed-property.

- Plan to search for unclaimed property every year.
- Start by searching for your organization's name.
- Then search for possible misspellings and abbreviations, and use different word orders. Try as many variations as you can think of.
 - For example: Search for "United Way of Pennsylvania," "United Way of Penna.," "United Way PA," "PA United Way," "Pennsylvania United Way," etc.
