As Pennsylvania's Treasurer, **I have good news to share!** Our records show that we have \$877.00 worth of unclaimed property that may belong to you. It's easy to review our information and file a claim so that we can return this money to you as soon as possible. (If you have multiple properties available to claim, you may receive a separate letter for each property.)

Just visit our website - patreasury.gov/unclaimed-property - and click "Search Now," then enter the Property ID listed above. (To see if additional properties are available to claim, search by your name as well.) You can also get to our website by scanning this QR code:



Once you're on our website, follow the simple steps to claim your money. You'll be able to choose how to receive your money - either ACH (direct deposit) or check. And here's a tip - if you include your Social Security number when you file your claim, it may help us return your money faster.

We've returned more than \$500 million over the past two years, and **I want to return this money to you!** If it's easier for you to call, our Bureau of Unclaimed Property is available to help at 800-222-2046 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. You can also email us at TUPmail@patreasury.gov for assistance. We look forward to hearing from you and getting your money back into the right hands!

P.S. Unclaimed property can include old bank accounts, uncashed checks, unredeemed rebates, forgotten safe deposit boxes, and much more. We're working to return more than **\$4.5 billion** to its rightful owners. More than one in ten Pennsylvanians is owed unclaimed property, and the average claim is worth about \$1,600.
